Summary of State Laws Relative to Legal Holidays Blue Law

- apply until midnight

- on Columbus Day apply until noon

on Veteran's Day apply until 1 p.m

- Work permits for "Blue Law" holidays
  - can be obtained at the discretion of local authorities
  - should be requested 60 days in advance
  - shall not cover more than one day Overtime

- In general, retailers\*\* (with 8 or more employees) are required to pay a minimum of time and one-half to non-professional employees working on all Sundays. All retailers, regardless of size, are required to pay a minimum of time and one-half on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Independence Day, Veteran's Day and on January 2 in years on which January 1 fall on a Sunday.

#### Other Holiday Facts

- When January 1 falls on a Sunday, retailers may open for regular hours the following day.

- The provisions of the law relating to overtime, to the stipulation that a person cannot be required to work and to permits concerning the opening of retail stores on restricted holidays, are enforced by the department of Fair Labor & Business Practices
