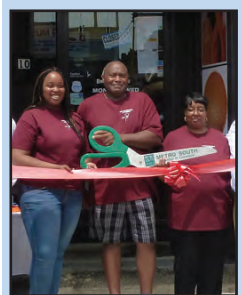

Janet Trask, RN, has been a nurse for over forty-one years. She recently retired from her position as Nurse Case Manager in Primary Care at the VA in Brockton where she worked for thirty-one years.

During her tenure at the VA, Janet helped heal war veterans ranging from World War I to the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. She has demonstrated a high level of compassion and care for patients, leading her team to treat more than 1,000 veterans, both emotionally and physically. Janet has also been especially supportive of the increasing number of women serving in the military, helping them adapt and assimilate back into society. Because of her commitment at the VA, Janet was recently recognized by the secretary of veteran affairs.

In the community, there is no greater champion than Janet. She is a Commissioner of the Brockton Housing Authority, where she serves as Assistant Treasurer. She is also on the Steering Committee of "Brockton's Promise." This summer Janet is volunteering for the 6th year in "Brockton After Dark" where she mentors young girls and children, engaging them in activities that keep them off the street. She is involved with Brockton Interfaith Community, serves on the Executive Committee of the Brockton Chapter of the NAACP, chairs the Health Committee, and is on the Brockton Multi-Services Site Board. She also serves on the Massasoit President's Community Advisory Board, has worked closely with the Brockton MainSpring House, and is on the Diversity Commission for Brockton, helping to prevent discrimination of women and minorities. Through her work at the VA and in the community, Janet has been nominated for an Unsung Hero's Award through the Massachusetts Woman's Commission and has received the Brockton High School Alumni Award.

Janet will say that perhaps her most important role in life is as mother and mentor to her 2 daughters Emily and Amanda, and her son, Daniel. She also mentors two young girls through a Christian mentoring program, taking them to community and legislative events, encouraging them to volunteer, and traveling with them.
