Garage Funding Approved Unanimously; "Trinity has Done a Great Job and They Should be Recognized."

At a recent Brockton City Council Finance Committee meeting held May 30, City Councilor Shirley Asack requested the microphone to publicly thank Trinity Financial Inc. (James Keefe, Kenan Bigby and Mathieu Zahler) for their investment in the former Enterprise Newspaper building and adjacent city block. The Enterprise Building had been vacant and the area underdeveloped before James Keefe, owner of Trinity Financial, acquired the entire city block and began to construct modern apartments, office space, street level retail and an artist gallery. The approved project has drawn 26 million dollars in MassWorks related investments and a projected 74 million dollars in additional public and private investment. The total of new investment is expected to top 100 million dollars over a 3-5 year time period. Bob Sullivan, President of

the Council, acknowledged the many business owners and leaders in attendance at the meeting and thanked them for their participation and their show of support for the parking garage. Chris Cooney, Chamber president and CEO, praised the investment made in Brockton, "Jim Keefe and Trinity Financial are creating vibrancy and sustainability in the very heart of the city's center. They have performed admirably and exceeded all expectations. When considering the new Veteran's Memorial Park and fountain, the completely renovated Enterprise office building and the new artist lofts/gallery space, this property is among the very best along the entire MBTA Commuter Rail serving the Metro South region. We thank the talented team at Trinity for transforming this area and making it a catalyst for positive change in Brockton."



9 Questions Smart Entrepreneurs Answer Before Starting Business From the SCORE Blog, www.score.org.

Answer the following 9 questions to better understand whether you're in the position to start a business and improve the odds of your business survival.

- 1) Who are my primary competitors in the industry? Not only do you need to understand your competitors so that you can understand the market, you also have to track these other businesses and their activities. In addition to your primary or direct competitors, it's important to stay aware of your indirect competitors; those who might not offer the exact product or service but may still eat into your market share.
- 2) How is the market responding to the industry? Tracking market research and understanding the flow of the economy can help entrepreneurs better estimate their likelihood of success.
- 3) How is my solution different from my competitors? Just because your business' market is growing doesn't mean you're guaranteed a home run. As markets become saturated, the important variables are product differentiation, customer service and brand equity.
- 4) Who is my ideal customer? You should answer some basic demographic questions about your customers: What is their age or gender? What is their income level? Why do they need your product with their lifestyle? These audience personas can help you develop products to meet their needs and market to them in the best ways possible.
- 5) How will I market by business? Before you start a business, it's important to understand where and how you are going to market that company. The best brands in the world have figured out how to communicate their value proposition effectively to the right people.
- 6) Will by business have a soft or hard launch? This question will determine how much flexibility you have for setbacks and scheduling.
- 7) How will I fund my business? Determine whether you will self-fund or have an investor-funded business. Another consideration to make is the ramifications it will have when your startup files its taxes. Forty percent of business owners list bookkeeping and tax preparation as the worst part of being a small business owner.
- 8) When and how to I turn a profit? Answering when you will turn a profit may depend on the funding option. Also, finding creative ways to stretch the dollar will help you turn a larger profit faster, such as accepting payments using ACH as oppose to credit card.
- 9) How will I define success after the first year? Running your business isn't about money only. Where do you see yourself in a year? Will you be ready to open a second location? Will you have five employees and a dozen clients? Along with profit goals, create personal goals to grow your business in the next six to 12 months.

Michael and Toni Rego always enjoyed listening to live jazz music. The problem? There were very few places to go south of Boston. In 2016, they set out on their dream to open a jazz bar in the Metro South and opened Epicure Wine Bar/Jazz Club in a strip mall located at 320 West Center Street in West Bridgewater. Epicure offers a wide selection of specialty wines and craft beers, creative culinary offerings, and live jazz music every Wednesday through Saturday. They bring a high caliber of nationally known jazz groups who perform at Scholars Jazz Club in Cambridge one night and at Epicure in West Bridgewater the next. What started out as a four day operation with one full-time person, cheese platters and 24 types of wine has grown to a 5 day operation with 4 employees, a full menu and over 60 types of wine. In addition, they now offer specialty events, such as brewery and winery pairing events and monthly four-course beer dinners. Epicure has also extended into the community. They are an active participant in the "be happy music" program, geared towards adults with special needs and abilities. They also host a jazz jam every Wednesday for local musicians. Epicure is currently working on developing a program to feature students from the local high school jazz programs including Brockton High School.

In 1976, Tim Holick, a skilled craftsman, began constructing countertops and cabinets for friends and family inside his garage. Soon after, Wood Palace Kitchens was formed. In three short years, the influx of business allowed Tim to expand Wood Palace Kitchens into the Metro South community. Now located at 7 Mill Street in Middleboro, Wood Palace Kitchens is one of the region's most trusted providers and installers of quality kitchens, cabinetry and countertops. They have doubled their employee count in the past three years to 10 employees, have grown from 100 to 150 retail clients per year, and have had revenues double from \$2 million to \$4 million. Wood Palace Kitchens demonstrates a high level of creativity and imagination in their marketing. Tim's book, "Dream First" provides a 9 minute crash course for customers and prospects to build their dream kitchen. Tim also hosts a weekly talk show, "Food-A-Holick" on WVBF 1530 AM, featuring local restaurant owners, and chefs. In addition, the company regularly hosts cooking classes with demonstrations by local chefs and high school culinary programs, as well as International Nights for the public to explore the showroom while enjoying multi-cultural cuisine. In the community, Wood Palace Kitchens has assisted in a variety of philanthropic ways. They have partnered with Special Olympics, Dana Farber Jimmy Fund, American Cancer Society, and the Salvation Army to name a few. They also donate a percentage of every cabinet they sell to the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

The Metro South Chamber of Commerce is convening some of the city of Brockton's largest employers, tax payers, and water users to discuss the city's water supply. The Chamber has been active in discussions and actions around Brockton's water supply challenges for more than thirty years, at one point distributing tens-of-thousands of water-saver kits to businesses and residents.

Securing enough water through primary and secondary sources is required by federal and state agencies and is critical for the city's long-term viability. Recently, the prospect of purchasing the federally and state approved Aquaria desalination plant was raised. The Chamber offered to convene a focus group of financial experts to consider the question of water supply and learn more about the thoughts and numbers around the recommendation to purchase the Aquaria water plant at this time. The Mayor of Brockton, the City's CFO and the Brockton Water Commission have unanimously recommended the purchase of the plant.


"By convening this focus group, the Chamber aims to learn more about the process implemented to recommend this purchase, the numbers involved and the outcomes of various scenarios. We thank the businesses and organizations who have accepted our invitation to participate. The financial and organizational expertise they bring to this discussion is important. Since the question has been placed before us as a community, we hope to increase the likelihood for the best possible decision to be made concerning this water supply proposal," said Chris Cooney, Chamber president and CEO.




