Downtown Developments

In recent months, developers have presented plans for two projects to the Chamber's Board of Directors; both have been met with positive comments. Kenan Bigby of Trinity and Jason Korb of Capstone have independently identified two prominent downtown properties for redevelopment. The projects are unrelated but both share proximately to Main Street and mass transit. Both will produce market rate and workforce housing. Combined, more than \$50 million dollars would be invested in downtown Brockton, producing both short and long-term benefits for the city. The Chamber unanimously voted in support of the Capstone plan and positively reviewed the Trinity proposal. Both projects are slated to begin within the year.



MassDevelopment Loans Help Local Company

MassDevelopment has provided two loans - a \$350,000 Gateway Cities loan and a \$145,200 Brownfield Redevelopment Fund loan - to 1200 Hoppy LLC, the real estate holding entity of David Lynch, who owns Lynch's Towing in Brockton. Lynch will use loan proceeds to clean up the contaminated property at 1200 Montello Street and undertake various construction projects.

Lynch purchased the property, the former location of Hoppy's Oil, in 2007. With petroleum contamination, the site had concerned Brockton city officials. The brownfields loan will support Lynch's site cleanup, and the Gateway Cities loan will help him complete improvements as the project progresses, including electrical work, masonry, roofing, and equipment. Lynch's Towing previously received a zero-interest loan from MassDevelopment's Brownfields Redevelopment Fund for site assessment. "Without the tremendous assistance of Lou Texeira and the Mass Development team, I could not revitalize this location to its potential," said David Lynch. "MassDevelopment, Mayor Linda Balzotti and Mary Waldron of the Brockton 21st Century Corporation assisted me with understanding that a brownfields is not something to run away from but with the right resources, can be brought back on the tax rolls and bring jobs to the city. I am appreciative of MassDevelopment's approval of this loan to my business and to Brockton as a Gateway City."

MassDevelopment, the state's finance and development authority, works with businesses, financial institutions, and communities to stimulate economic growth across the Commonwealth. During FY2010, MassDevelopment financed or managed 238 projects in 104 communities across the state generating investment of nearly \$1.4 billion in the Massachusetts economy.

Maybe you visit the building frequently to cash in your recyclables. But did you know that Shoe City is the contract company in partnership with the Brockton Area Arc that employs over one hundred individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities?

The Redemption Center was started over 25 years ago with just a few individuals sorting cans and bottles. This was used as a way to teach individuals with disabilities how to count, while giving them access to the community at the same time. It also promoted awareness to community members about programs like The Arc. Today, Shoe City Redemption Center processes about 216,000 bottles and cans a month and 3.2 million bottles and cans a year. Shoe City sees a lot of regulars that drop off recyclables every week, and they keep coming back to support The Arc. There are also several accounts for schools, churches, sports programs, boy scouts, etc. You can select to have your redemption donated to any of these accounts.

Shoe City employs 6 individuals, who each work three to five days a week under the supervision of Jean Snow-Haskell. Workers can claim both the federal and state EITC, even if they do not owe income tax, simply by filing federal and state income tax returns. You will receive a state credit equal to 15% of the federal amount. Millions of eligible workers risk missing out on these important federal tax benefits which are also matched to a lesser degree by the state.




