The meeting follows a recent vote of the Chamber's Board of Directors in support of a gaming/entertainment complex on the site of the former dog-track. "This site has hosted state-regulated gaming for the past forty years. If gaming is to return to Massachusetts, the dog-track site should be a top pick. With more than 600 workers trained in the gaming industry available for rehire, and the likely addition of a commuter rail station linking it to Boston, the dog-track is a natural site for selection, said Chamber President and CEO Christopher

upgrades to the facility within the past few years. The facility is recognized as state-of-the-art, operating as a model for regions of similar size throughout the country. "Greater use of this facility is a smart business decision and a sustainable green choice for our region and communities, said Chamber President and CEO Christopher Cooney. "Our businesses and residents should not be forced to build and pay for redundant, costly smaller versions of what we already have here within reach", said Chamber Chairman, Peter

Neville, CEO of Concord Foods. More than \$1 million dollars has been spent on numerous studies by local communities to explore building redundant smaller local wastewater facilities because of dated U.S. EPA limits on the regional facility. State allowances on the facility are greater but have yet to be adopted by the U.S. EPA. The Chamber urges the EPA to repermit this facility to accommodate the pent up demand. It is for the health of all our citizens and the benefit of the Brockton area communities.
