142nd Brockton Fair Set; **Horse Racing Returns**



June 30 - July 10, the Brockton Fair is set to return this summer 2016, with horse racing added to the mix.

According to the Blood-Horse, Thoroughbred Horse Racing News:, "The Massachusetts Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Carney Family, owners of the Brockton Fairgrounds, have finalized a two-year purse agreement for 30 days of live racing at the facility in 2016 and 2017.

'We have a deal,' said Chris Carney. 'We're looking at purses of about \$150,000 per day, depending upon how much we'll have allocated from the Race Horse Development Fund. We're planning on running two to three days per week, and with local horsemen,' he continued."

The Brockton Fair started its journey into thoroughbred racing in 1941, part of the MA Fair Racing Circuit; it ended racing in 1972.

Prostate Cancer High Mortality - Get Tested

Did you know that prostate cancer is the most common and the second most lethal malignancy in American men? The disease strikes as many as one in five black men, who are 2.5 times more likely to die compared to other ethnic groups. According to the recent data from the National Cancer Institute, Plymouth County has the highest prostate cancer mortality rate in black men in Massachusetts. In Brockton, prostate cancer mortality in Black men is 39 percent higher than the state average, according to the Department of Health's MassChip database. Screening allows for the early detection of prostate cancer, which is critical for saving lives.

That's why the Brockton NAACP has partnered with AdMeTech Foundation and Good Samaritan Medical Center to raise awareness and education in Brockton. The three organizations held a Prostate Cancer Awareness Day this year, offering educational sessions, consultations, and resources. Algonquin Gas Line, which connects to the Texas Eastern Transmission and Maritimes Northeast pipelines.

The Chamber recently met with Spectra Energy to discuss a new natural energy proposal that could save residents and businesses money while providing a safer and cleaner alternative. Spectra's proposal includes the expansion of the 60 year old Algonquin natural gas pipeline to serve power generators already connected to the system for coal burning and the replacement of approximately 125 miles of pipes.

Massachusetts employers pay some of the most expensive electricity costs in the nation. These costs impact the Commonwealth and Metro South's ability to compete. Nuclear Power Plants in Plymouth and Somerset will soon be going offline which could lead to additional price spikes and blackouts. Spectra's proposal could help prevent this from happening. It would also generate billions of dollars annually for New England and help to attract and retain manufacturing and industrial businesses and provide a cleaner energy solution.



Upon graduation, Stephanie became only the 5th singleseat female fighter pilot to complete the demanding course. Stephanie was deployed with the "Stingers in 2014, where she flew combat missions over both Iraq and Syria in support of Operation INHERENT RESOLVE, earning her fourth Air Medal.

Throughout her aviation career, Stephanie has accrued over 1450 hours in tactical aircraft and 304 carrier arrested landings, which include 127 nighttime arrestments. Over the course of three deployments, she has executed 77 combat sorties flown over Afghanistan, Iraq and Syria. Stephanie is married to Commander Jeff Latham, of Lithia Springs, Georgia. They live in Hanford, California with their spoiled labrador, Bevan.
