Several Brockton based business and property owners are planning to attend a scheduled hearing to review proposed commercial tax rates in Brockton. Tax rates and assessments have been rising while vacancies have increased this past year. Many commercial property owners have begun working with the Chamber to coordinate a concise and convincing message regarding the correlation between higher commercial property tax rates and vacant commercial buildings. As a result, the loss of businesses and jobs in a community often leads to compounding the problem on the residential side as well. The group will encourage the city to adopt more business friendly policies to capitalize on Brockton's significant assets. Business friendly policies increase demand for commercial property, decrease business property vacancies and strengthen business property tax values and collections. Award Winning Journalist at 97th Annual Meeting

Mary Richardso

Richardson began her broadcasting career in 1973 at KCRA-TV in Sacramento, CA. By 1975, she was the station's coanchor for the 5PM and 11PM newscasts. The former WNAC-TV brought Richardson to New

England in 1978 when she became the first female in Boston to co-anchor an 11 o'clock newscast. Richardson joined WCVB in 1980 as a news reporter and anchor. She also served four years as the host of Five on Five. For a decade Richardson co-hosted the annual Holiday at Pops! Concert as well as the popular Pops Goes the Fourth! Celebration. Richardson is best known as the co-anchor of WCVB-TV's Chronicle from 1984-2010. Chronicle is the nation's longest running locally produced nightly news magazine.

In April 2010, Richardson received the first-ever Tim Russert Award from Boston Healthcare for the Homeless. Other honors bestowed on Richardson include: the 2009 National Academy of Arts and Sciences Silver Circle Award recognizing Richardson's significant contributions to her community, the television industry and to individuals training for careers in the field of television; a 2009 Honorary Doctorate from Regis College; and the Exceptional Woman Award in 2008.

With Richardson as co-anchor, Chronicle has won two prestigious Alfred I. duPont-

Columbia University Awards, several national Gabriel Awards and numerous local Emmy Awards. As co-host of Pops Goes the Fourth!, she shared a national Primetime Emmy nomination. Over the years, Richardson has generously donated her time to countless Massachusetts charities, such as Horizons for Homeless Children in Boston, Boston Healthcare for the Homeless, the Inner City Schools Foundation, as well as the New England Province of Jesuits. In addition, Richardson co-produced an Emmy Award-winning documentary on AIDS with her husband, Stan Levin.

Richardson is now a community liaison for the Caritas chain's six hospitals, working to ensure that local residents know about the resources available to them. As part of her new job, she drives to the six hospitals, meets people at the facilities, finds out what their needs and gripes are, and works with hospital officials to address them. She's also producing small pieces for webcasts that feature each hospital, a part of the job that is nearly identical to what she did on Chronicle for 26 years.

Also at this meeting, Economic Impact Awards will be presented to businesses who have made a significant investment in the Metro South region over the past year. Board service awards will also be presented.

HarborOne Credit Union ESOL Program

As of the third anniversary of the HarborOne Credit Union MultiCultural Banking Center on Legion Parkway in Brockton, twenty-two ESOL courses both in Basic and Intermediate English have been completed. Four Hundred and thirteen students have attended these programs. In addition, HarborOne offering these programs has alleviated the burdens falling on many non-profit agencies offering ESOL but adversely impacted by funding as a result of the recession. When the MultiCultural Banking Center opened, it made ESOL classes a focus due to a documented waiting list of over 2,000 local residents looking for such courses. HarborOne officials felt that ESOL would be an excellent way to build trust with local immigrants, the ones most victimized by predatory financial practices. It offers courses in Computer Basics for the same reason.

Brockton Producing Strong Workforce for Future



In a recent article in the NY Times, Brockton High School received accolades as a model for academic

success, transforming a school with low performing test scores a decade ago to a school that outperformed 90% of Massachusetts High Schools this year. The results are especially surprising since it is believed that small schools almost always perform better. With 4,100 students, Brockton High is, in contrast, the largest public school in Massachusetts and one of the largest in the nation. The turnaround has attracted national recognition and the attention of Ronald F. Ferguson, an economist at Harvard who researches the minority achievement gap. Ferguson recently featured Brockton High in his report "How High Schools Become Exemplary".

The academic success of Brockton High can be largely attributed to Principal Dr. Susan Szachowic and a handful of teachers known as the

restructuring committee who organized a schoolwide campaign that involved adding reading, writing, speaking, and reasoning into every class, including gym. Among the new initiatives of the committee include devoting faculty meetings to training department heads and teachers on a proper writing rubric, encouraging writing exercises in all subjects that allow students to think methodically, and not succumbing to federal policy which encourages failing schools to consider replacing at least half of the teachers. Brockton High has eliminated the tracking system which channeled students into one of five academic paths, which set low expectations for some students. Also, Brockton High now posts banners recognizing academic awards, and has eliminated academic exceptions for athletes.

Northeastern University. She regularly appears as a commentator on consumer protection issues in the New York and New England media markets.






