Commissioner, he led efforts to enhance quality of care, while reducing costs in the nation's most innovative health care that include the All Payer Claims Database, Health Care Cost Trends market analysis hearings, in partnership with the State's Attorney General. In addition, as a member of the Health Care Cost and Quality Council, Morales worked to standardize the metrics used to publicly measure quality, as well as total medical expense.

Morales also served as Deputy Chief of Staff to Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick, and Senior Advisor to Massachusetts Senate President Robert E. Travaglini. In both roles, he led efforts on issues that included health care policy, economic development and life sciences. Finally, Morales also has extensive knowledge in the pharmaceutical market and implemented the nation's first prescription drug insurance model, Prescription Advantage, which influenced the creation of Medicare. Part D. Morales is a dedicated public and community servant, who has founded multiple non-profit organizations committed to fostering leadership.

- 1) Undertake an export readiness assessment. Take a short test to see if you are ready to export your product on Mass Export's web site at www.mass.gov/export. Under "Publications", click on "The International Business Plan Workbook".
- 2) Update and improve your web site. Can international customers understand it? Do you have a button for them to click that speaks to them in their language?
- Use SEO (Search Engine Optimization) techniques to improve web site searches so that potential customers around the world will come to your site.
- 4) Reach out to your international customers, often. Use any one of the many email customer relationship products to tailor newsletters, special offers, and other communications to your global customers.
- 5) Identify good face to face marketing opportunities. Trade shows are some of the best marketing opportunities to enter or expand a presence in a foreign market.
- 6) Turn domestic marketing into international marketing. Every major US trade show and publication has international attendees and readers.

7) Research your overseas markets, and stay on top of trends. Often, the best market opportunities or opportunities for growth for your products are outside the Unites States.

8) Expand your network. Most small companies export through distributors in key markets. Research and identify distributors of complementary products in those markets, and approach them to determine their interest in handing your product line. 9) Identify additional resources you may need. Do you have the right financial, legal, marketing and logistical resources in place to help you find prospects, negotiate the deal, protect yourself legally, get the goods to their destination, and most importantly, to get paid at the end?






