GMMS On the Road: The Economic Impact of Education

Wednesday, September 21

The 2011/2012 Season of Good Morning Metro South will kick off on Wednesday, September 21, 2011, 7:30 am - 9:00 am at the Dunn Conference Suite at Bridgewater State University. The featured speakers are Richard M. Freeland,

Commissioner of Higher Education in Massachusetts, and Dr. Martha J. Kanter, Under Secretary of Education, U.S. Deparment of Education.

In an uncertain economy, one fact is clear: Massachusetts residents who graduate from college fare better, overall, than those who never earned post-secondary degrees. Within the next ten years, six of every ten jobs will require at least an associate's degree. The Commonwealth will need a more highly skilled workforce - and business and industry will need local colleges and universities to scale up quickly with programs to meet their fast-changing, highly specialized workforce needs.

These trends, coupled with the rising costs of a private college education, are driving a new focus on public higher education in Massachusetts. Higher Education Commissioner Richard M. Freeland will detail the "master plan" for the state's public colleges and universities, called the Vision Project. This effort, involving


all 29 public campuses, aims to position Massachusetts as a leader in public higher educa-

Bridgewater Business Association Joins Affiliation with Metro South Chamber




Bridgewater Business Association recently signed an affiliation agreement with the Metro





Chamber Mourns Board Member Dr. Ed Minnock

Some people transcend local borders. Some lives leave a legacy that goes beyond geography and becomes part of the fabric of our lives no matter where the story of that life occurred. Ed Minnock was such a man.

He lived just such a life, a life that became part of the fabric of other lives - including mine - here locally and across the globe. Simply put,

Ed's life and his work provided me with a lesson and us with a legacy, a legacy of

I had lunch with Ed last week. We enjoyed a great meal and even better conversation. We chatted about our families and our lives; we talked of his upcoming trip to Europe and his previous journeys around the globe, and my journeys within the borders of Bridgewater. Our conversations were always engaging and enjoyable. Minutes after our visit was over, though, so was his meaningful life of purpose. Ed passed the afternoon of our lunch meeting. As we shook hands and exchanged warm and genuine smiles, I could not, I did not imagine that I would never see my friend again.

His official title was Vice President of External Affairs for Bridgewater State University. He was the University's primary liaison with local, state, and national governments from Bridgewater to Bangkok. In his case his title, "External Affairs," meant just around the corner and just around the continent. His job, though, was Ambassador of Friendship, and he did it with ease and aplomb.

To know Ed for a minute was to know a new friend. I only had the gift of that friendship for a little more than a year, but felt the stinging loss of a pal and confidant. For a man with a Ph.D and the title of Vice President of one of Massachusetts' finest public institutions of higher learn-

ing, Ed was neither boastful nor proud. That humility is indeed part of his legacy. It was only after his passing that I learned through another colleagueturned-friend, Sue McCombe, that Ed had an amazing and notable history serving our nation. He was the only soldier ever to earn the high honor of the Legion of Merit while holding the rank of private. In March of 1968, he was working in Army Intelligence and accu-

rately predicted the size, time, and route of an enemy attack, and then coordinated and directed the counteroffensive on enemy headquarters. His insight, intel, and achievement led to his induction into the Military Intelligence Hall of Fame in 1990.

This is a remarkable achievement and story of heroism in and of itself, but the story, and the real lesson of Ed, the Ambassador of Friendship, though, is how he lived his life after those wartime events. He worked in law enforcement. He pursued higher education and received his doctoral degree. He had a beautiful family. During all that, he remained involved with, and committed to, his community - and his tireless work of building a network of genuine friends.

Upon his arrival at BSU, the University had cooperative relationships with a handful of universities in other countries. When he left us last week, and through Ed's commitment to building those relationships, those friendships, worldwide, Bridgewater State provides reciprocal educational opportunities for students in more than forty countries. An Ambassador of Friendship, indeed.

That's Ed's legacy. He was my friend the moment we met. You just can't learn the sort of sincerity and warmth he possessed. It's simply a gift, and in his case, a gift he shared with thousands of lives in thousands of places thousands of times. Every person who had the gift of meeting Ed Minnock was better for the experience.





Brockton Projects Awarded Historic Tax Credits

Two Brockton redevelopment projects have received a total of \$1 million in historic rehabilitation tax credits from Secretary of State William F. Galvin's office.

Capstone Communities LLC and Brophy & Phillips Company each received \$500,000 in tax credits from the Massachusetts Historical Commission to help finance the proposed redevelopment projects in the downtown area. The awards are the first for the city.

The Capstone Communities' project plans to turn 124 Montello St., the former Stall and Dean sporting goods company, into a 25-unit apartment building that will include market-rate rentals and affordable spaces for working families and artists.

Brophy & Philips proposal for 88 Lincoln St. will turn the former mill into commercial

"Receipt of the awards is the result of collaboration between the developers, the city, Brockton's planning and economic development agencies, as well as our state delegation. Getting two of these awards illustrates a sincere interest and investment in Brockton's redevelopment and growth," said Mayor Linda Balzotti.

"The granting of these two historic tax credits will have an enormous impact on the future of downtown Brockton allowing for the creation of jobs, housing and business, as well as stimulating further economic development. We sincerely thank Secretary Galvin and the Massachusetts Historical Commission," said State Representative Michael Brady.




