

Health Care Resources Website Launched

To assist small businesses with the transition to National Healthcare, a new website is now active. Business.USA.gov/healthcare, a onestop-shop Website which will provide employers of all sizes with educational materials on how the Affordable Care Act may affect businesses and help them compete. The site includes a wizard tool that is tailored based on size and location, so businesses can learn how the law helps them provide affordable coverage options to their employees while still meeting their bottom line. The site will act as a user-friendly hub that connects employers to informational content on tax credits and other provisions of the law from the Small Business Administration (SBA), the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and the Treasury Department.

Additional benefits will take effect in late 2013 and beyond. Starting

October 1, 2013, individuals, including those who are self-employed, and small businesses looking for a better plan, will have a new way to shop for private health insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace and the Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP) found at HealthCare.gov. Individuals may be eligible for lower costs on their monthly premiums and self-employed individuals and small businesses may be eligible for tax credits to help with the costs of coverage.

The Chamber is committed to helping small businesses navigate through the new health care law over the next two years and will continue to provide information as it becomes available through media outlets, forums and hosting important speakers on the topic of health care at upcoming events. Chamber Advocates for Computer Tax Repeal

The Massachusetts Legislature recently enacted a new sales tax on computer software services as part of a massive \$800 million transportation financing plan. The law applies the state's 6.25 percent sales tax to computer system design and to modification, integration, enhancement, installation, or configuration of standardized or pre-writ-

Massachusetts has the highest percentage of tech workers in any state. The new law threatens to make the state less competitive in an industry that Massachusetts has excelled at, and it strikes at the heart of ingenuity, innovation and entrepreneurship in Massachusetts. The tax could cripple small IT service companies and drive sales and services companies outside of Massachusetts. Currently only four other states issue a tax on computer and software services, all at a lower rate than Massachusetts.

The Metro South Chamber advocates for the repeal of this tax and encourages the Massachusetts Legislature to consider other alternatives that will not harm the state's innovation economy and small businesses.


Chamber Credited in Brockton Postcard Book






