



MassRIDES is a free program of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation designed to help reduce traffic congestion and improve air quality and mobility. Through MassRIDES, companies can offer employees rewards for their green trips and eligibility for the Emergency Ride Home program!

Bay State Commute—get rewarded for your green trips! In addition to finding a carpool partner or a vanpool to join, log your trips to earn rewards for any green commute you take.

Employees who commute green at least twice a week are also eligible for the Emergency Ride Home program, which may be used up to four times per calendar year. MassRIDES provides commuters with this free commuter insurance and will reimburse commuters up to \$100 per ride if you need to take a taxi, rental car, or get a ride home with a coworker in the event of an unexpected emergency.

Learn about selling to the State as a small and diverse business! On Wednesday, January 31, 2018, representatives from the Massachusetts Supplier Diversity Office (SDO) will host the first session of its "SDO in the Community Days" at the Metro South Chamber of Commerce. Community Days, a new initiative by the SDO, is your opportunity to meet one-on-one with an SDO representative during which time you will discuss the programs and services available to small and diverse firms through the Operational Services Division (OSD), the parent agency of the SDO. Meeting slots are in 15-minute increments, beginning at 9:30 a.m. through 2:30 p.m. Meeting availability is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Request your time slot by emailing us at wsdo@state.ma.us, indicating your preferred meeting time.

The mission of the Supplier Diversity Office is to increase business opportunities for small and diverse firms. The SDO offers free certification programs for minority-, women-, veteran-, service-disabled veteran-, disability-, LGBT-, and Portuguese-owned business enterprises and verification of small Massachusetts businesses. Free business resources available through OSD include registration on COMMBUYS, the Commonwealth's online market center, training classes to learn about selling to the state, and networking events. At your one-on-one meeting, you will learn if your firm may qualify to participate in one of SDO's programs, how to register to receive email notifications of bidding opportunities, and be given the tools to continue your learning after the meeting.



Work permits for "Blue Law" holidays

- In general, retailers** (with 8 or more employees) are required to pay a minimum of time and one-half to non-professional employees working on all Sundays. All retailers, regardless of size, are required to pay a minimum of time and one-half on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Independence Day, Veteran's Day and on January 2 in years on which January 1 falls on a Sunday.

Other Holiday Facts

- When January 1 falls on a Sunday, retailers may open for regular hours the following day.
- The provisions of the law relating to overtime, to the stipulation that a person cannot be required to work and to permits concerning the opening of retail stores on restricted holidays, are enforced by the department of Fair Labor & Business Practices.

Older adults, age 55 years and up, with chronic medical conditions making it challenging to live at home safely, may qualify for the program. With the addition of our second PACE location in Brockton, our service area now includes 18 cities and towns in Plymouth and Bristol County.
