

More about Jean Fox: A former Freetown Selectman, Jean has participated on numerous educational boards and committees in the Southcoast, was a founding board member of the Alma del Mar Charter School and a SMILES mentor for three years.

Prior to joining MassDOT in 2011, Jean was the Youth Council Director and LiteracyWorks Entrepreneur at the Greater New Bedford Workforce Investment Board. Jean also served on the Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development District (SRPEDD) Commission, the Metropolitan Planning Organization, and the SRTA Advisory Board. She has been active in bringing much-needed attention to the transportation needs of the region, working on a Transit Development Plan in New Bedford, advocating for reliable transportation for women and students to get to and from work, jobs, education, healthcare, and childcare.

Fox earned her B.A. from the University of New Mexico and M.B.A. from George Washington University. She lives in Freetown with her husband, Lou, and has three grown children. In addition to the Freetown Board of Selectmen, she has served on the Bristol County Commission on the Status of Women, the South Coast Education Compact, as well as a number of school and education advisory boards in New Bedford.

Jean has been recognized by several regional organizations for her commitment to the area, to her community, to women and girls, as well as education and workforce development. She was named a Woman of Distinction by the YWCA of Southeastern Massachusetts in 2013. She received the Lifelong Achievement Award from the Massachusetts Association of School Committees in 2010. She was named Commissioner of the Year in 2010 by SRPEDD. In 2006, Jean was recognized as an "Unsung Heroine" by the Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women for her volunteerism. Jean was named Freetown Woman of the Year in 1999.

Mr. DiPasquale holds a master's degree from Northeastern University and a bachelor's degree from Arkansas Tech University. He also received an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters bestowed by the New England Institute of Technology.

Groundbreaking @ 28 Petronelli, 18 Apartments



28 Petronelli Way is a historic four story brick building in the center of downtown Brockton, with an elaborate Romanesque Revival façade. It was built in 1890 as the St. Patrick's Total Abstinence Society Building, and included a theater on the upper floor with a full balcony. It had other community oriented meeting rooms on the second and third floors, and four

retail spaces on the street level. In the 1980s it housed the Petronelli Brothers' boxing gym where World Champion Marvin Hagler trained. 28 Petronelli LLC, an affiliate of Concord Square Planning & Development, Inc., purchased the property in March 2019 from the City of Brockton. Extensive work was immediately carried out to stabilize the building, cover the roof, and remove debris. It is planned to be renovated into 18 market rate apartments including 6 studios, 9 one-bedroom, and 3 two-bedroom units. Project financing includes Historic Tax Credits, HDIP Tax Credits, a tax exemption agreement with the City, a construction loan, and Opportunity Zone eligible equity investment. 

EMPOWER SMALL BUSINESSES: Additional COVID Business Resources and Grants from Mass Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC)

Baker-Polito Administration Launches "HireNow" Hiring and Training Employer Grant Program

\$4,000/Employee Program Aims to Boost Hiring with Labor Force Participation Rates Still Lower than Pre-Pandemic



The Baker-Polito Administration has launched a new hiring and training employer grant program, "HireNow," which will help employers quickly hire and train new workers and get more people back to work. The new program provides eligible employers with a \$4,000 per employee grant, which can be used to cover training costs or as a signing bonus for new employees. By providing employers with these flexible funds to facilitate quick hiring, the Administration is focusing on addressing continued hiring challenges faced by employers and increasing labor force participation. Employers can learn more about the program and apply at mass.gov/HireNow.

The program is open to all Massachusetts employers, including both for-profit and non-profit entities (excluding federal, state, and municipal governments). Governor Charlie Baker, Lt. Governor Karyn Polito and Labor and Workforce Development Secretary Rosalin Acosta announced the launch of the program today at LabCentral, a Cambridge non-profit that provides support and working space for start-ups in the biotech and life sciences sectors. LabCentral plans to hire lab operations and other technical and administrative staff this year and will use funds from HireNow to support training costs.

HireNow aims to address hiring challenges faced by employers that have been brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. According to a recent analysis of Bureau of Labor Statistics data, there are over 85,000 workers not participating in the labor market compared to pre-pandemic levels. Meanwhile, employers' need for workers has continued to increase, with unfilled job postings up 20% compared to pre-pandemic levels and approximately 200,000 open jobs available across the Commonwealth.

Program Details:

- **Employer Eligibility:** Any Massachusetts employer who is in good standing with Department of Unemployment Assistance and Department of Revenue obligations and is not de-barred by the state is eligible (excluding federal, state, and municipal governments). Applications must be submitted by the employer, not an education or training partner.

- **Application Process:** Employers must pre-register online at Mass.Gov/HireNow by providing employer information. Following the employee's hire and 60-day retention period, employers will submit a final application for funding. The Commonwealth will also approve the planned use of the funds (training costs, signing bonus, etc.) when approving the application.

- **Eligible Hires:** Hires must be made after March 23, 2022, be retained for a minimum of 60 days, and be placed in jobs that are at least 30 hours per week. New hires need to be Massachusetts residents employed in Massachusetts. There are also limits on compensation:

- Minimum eligible compensation: \$14.25 / hr (minimum wage)
- Maximum eligible compensation: \$42.50 / hr (~\$85K annualized)

RAFT Program Offers \$10K Grants for Housing



The state-funded RAFT (Residential Assistance to Families in Transition), and ERAP (Emergency Rental Assistance Program) programs are tools used by the Housing Consumer Education Centers team to provide eligible households or individuals funding that can be used to help keep their housing, obtain new housing, or otherwise avoid becoming homeless. Funds provides short-term emergency financial assistance to help eligible tenants, landlords, or homeless by assisting with mortgage payments, rent, utility bills, and other costs. This special program targets households facing instability as a result of a COVID-19 (Coronavirus) related housing crisis due to a loss of wages or increase in expenses (e.g., medical expenses). The Massachusetts Homeowner Assistance Fund (Mass HAF) is available for homeowners who are behind on their mortgage payments because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The goal of HAF is to prevent foreclosures and displacements of eligible homeowners. Mass HAF is funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
