

What is a Business Improvement District (BID)?

Business improvement districts (BIDs) are privately directed and publicly sanctioned organizations that supplement public services within geographically defined boundaries by generating multiyear revenue through a compulsory assessment on local property owners and/or businesses. BIDs, which are organized under State and local law, are managed by public or nonprofit boards, predominantly with local business representation, and sometimes with residents and local government officials as well. BIDs create collective economic benefits for their members that cannot be achieved on an individual basis. BIDs levy an additional fee on properties within a defined geographic area, and the proceeds are directed toward improvement purposes within the district. If authorized to do so, BIDs may rely on other sources of revenue, in addition to the compulsory fee, to fund their operations.

BIDs were first formed in the early 1970s to allow private property owners in traditional downtown or commercial areas to compete with private shopping malls. Private mall owners provide security, sanitation, and wayfinding services that are sometimes perceived to be better than those provided in traditional downtowns or commercial shopping districts. Local governments often believe that they cannot provide enhanced services to a commercial district (a subset of all taxpayers) without creating complaints about favoritism, inequity, or undue influence. Private businesses believed that if they individually voluntarily provided such services, non-contributing businesses would benefit unfairly (i.e., the "free rider" problem).

BIDs today tend to fund ongoing services and maintenance activities such as enhanced security, sanitation, and marketing. BIDs might also engage in capital projects important to transportation, such as bicycle and pedestrian improvements, landscaping, storefront renovations, and wayfinding signage. BIDs often develop their own branding and marketing schemes, including logos, slogans, and advertising.

Apply for Diversity Certification as a Massachusetts-based Business Date & Time: 12/15 @ 10am **Description:** The Supplier Diversity Office certifies companies as Massachusetts Minority Business

Enterprises (MBE), Women Business Enterprises (WBE), Veteran Business Enterprises (VBE), and Portuguese Business Enterprises (PBE). Business owners of companies with a principal place of business in Massachusetts must attend a mandatory, two-hour pre-certification workshop before applying for certification. The certification application and instructions to create an SDO portal account will be provided via email within 1-2 days after the workshop. The pre-certification workshop provides an overview of the State certification criteria and process, the SDO portal platform and the required documents that must be submitted when applying for certification. The workshop also provides a brief introduction to COMMBUYS (the Commonwealth's procurement platform where bidding opportunities occur), the Small Business Purchasing Program, and the Supplier Diversity Program. During the certification process, the SDO investigates applicant companies to make sure they meet applicable legal requirements. Under state regulations as defined in 425 CMR 2.00, the applicant firm must prove it is at least 51% owned and dominantly controlled by adult minority, women, Portuguese, or veteran principals who are U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents. Firms also must be ongoing and independent.


