





Massachusetts Secretary of Transportation, Monica Tibbits- Nutt



#### **ABOUT THE SPEAKERS:**

Monica G. Tibbits-Nutt is the Secretary of Transportation and CEO of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT).

As Secretary, she is responsible for the four divisions of MassDOT: Highway, Rail and Transit, the Registry of Motor Vehicles, and Aeronautics. In this position, she also serves on the Massport and MBTA Board of Directors.

Tibbits-Nutt was previously appointed Undersecretary of Transportation by Governor Healey in January 2023, before being sworn in as Acting Secretary for Transportation in September. As Undersecretary, she led the effort to stand up the first-ever Office of Transportation and Climate

Planning and Policy. Tibbits-Nutt previously served on both the MassDOT Board of Directors and as the Vice-Chair of the Fiscal Management and Control Board (FMCB) that oversaw the MBTA from 2015-2021.

Prior to joining the Governor's Cabinet, she was Executive Director of 128 Business Council, a transportation management association and regional service provider that builds privately funded, cooperative public transportation routes throughout the Route 128 West Corridor.

Areas of specialty include regional and transportation planning, urban design, and transit equity. In both her work and research, she is particularly interested in capitalizing upon every opportunity to better educate transportation stakeholders and the public about all aspects of the planning process. As part of this focus on education, she serves as the Vice President of the non-profit Youth Engagement Planning (YEP!), which brings urban planning and community advocacy into K-12 environments.

Secretary Tibbits-Nutt is an active member of the American Institute of Certified Planners and a LEED Accredited Professional in Building Design & Construction with the U.S. Green Building Council. Rachel Heller became CHAPA's CEO in 2016, after joining the agency as the Director of Public Policy in 2012. Rachel is responsible for providing strategic leadership and overseeing all activities of the organization. She works in partnership with the Board of Directors to articulate and execute CHAPA's mission. Rachel previously worked as the Director of Public Policy at the Alliance for Business Leadership, served as Chief of Staff to Massachusetts State Senator Susan Tucker, and was the Senior Policy Advocate at Homes for Families, a nonprofit advocacy organization working to end family homelessness. Rachel holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Peace Studies from the University of Connecticut.

About CHAPA: Born out of a small group of community leaders who understood that housing was a critical issue of the civil rights movement in 1967, Citizens' Housing and Planning Association (CHAPA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit whose mission is

to encourage the production and preservation of housing that is affordable to low and moderate-income families and individuals and to foster diverse and sustainable communities through planning and community development.

CHAPA helped create the Massachusetts Affordable Housing Law (Chapter 40B), which was developed so that families and individuals with low and moderate incomes could find safe and affordable homes in every city and town in the Commonwealth. CHAPA also helped create our own state rental subsidy programs, the state's Low Income Housing Tax Credit, and the strongest expiring use law in the nation (Chapter 40T).

Throughout CHAPA's history, we have successfully advocated for the passage of numerous Housing Bond Bills and legislative priorities to fund affordable housing development and programs throughout Massachusetts.

At the core of our work, we believe that every person in Massachusetts should have a safe, healthy, and affordable place to call home. CHAPA achieves this by advocating for opportunity, expanding access to housing, and developing the field. Visit www.chapa.org to learn more.

### **New Labor Laws Went into Effect July 1: Overtime**



Starting July 1, 2024, significant changes to U.S. overtime rules will take effect. The Department of Labor (DOL) is increasing the salary thresholds for overtime exemptions under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). The standard salary threshold will rise from \$684 per week (\$35,568 per year) to \$844 per week (\$43,888 per year). For highly compensated employees, the threshold will increase from \$107,432 per year to \$132,964 per year.

Furthermore, on January 1, 2025, these thresholds will rise again. The standard salary threshold will go up to \$1,128 per week (\$58,656 per year), and for highly compensated employees, it will increase to \$151,164 per year.

program through 2024. Additionally, BAT received a \$430,000 grant to expand its existing microtransit service and offer new subsidized late night/early morning employment trips via taxi, Uber or Lyft. "Sincere thanks are in order to Mayor Sullivan and the entire BAT Board of Directors for their leadership, as well as to the Governor and State Legislature for their strong commitment to expanding regional transit options across the Commonwealth," stated BAT Administrator Lambert.

• **Increased service** – Starting on July 1st, half hour bus frequencies will be expanded to runthroughout BAT's weekday city service from 6:40 a.m. until 9:30 p.m.

"As Mayor, I am thrilled that BAT will increase services during the summer months," said Brockton Mayor and BAT Board Chair Sullivan. "This enhanced amenity will benefit Brockton residents and business owners. It will also benefit visitors to the 'City of Champions' and assist neighboring municipalities and communities."

• Extended fare free program – The new MassDOT grant in the amount of \$261,000 combined withprevious state grant funding will allow all of BAT's fixed route and paratransit services to run withoutfare collection through December 31, 2024.


