

Chamber Hosts Congressman Auchincloss, Town of Chamber Hosts Supplier Diversity Office in Brockton Sharon Economic Update, Mass Office of Business **Development at Sharon Community Center**



The Chamber's recent Good Day Metro South luncheon put the spotlight on Sharon, exploring the town's economic development strategies and regional business challenges. With one-third of its land undevelopable due to conservation restrictions and wetlands, Sharon has embraced innovative commercial projects—most notably, the Commonwealth's newest Costco in a mixed-use development zone.

A panel featuring Sharon's Town Administrator Fred Turkington, economic leaders, and state representatives discussed strategies for growth, while Congressman Jake Auchincloss addressed pressing business concerns, including potential tariffs on Canada, Medicaid funding, and support for higher education. He emphasized the importance of investing in workforce development to ensure local businesses can attract and retain top talent.




