Reves is an economist who has devoted his career to the cause of public higher education, holding leadership positions at the University of Illinois Chicago (UIC), West Virginia University, and the

University of Arkansas. He most recently served as interim chancellor of UIC, Chicago's largest university campus. Born and raised in Mexico, Reyes is the first Hispanic to serve as chancellor of UMass Amherst.

Reyes received his bachelor's degree in economics from the Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey, Campus Estado de Mexico, in 1998, and his doctorate in economics from Texas A&M University in 2003. 



Tracks to Transformation: Integrating Real Estate, Opportunity Zones, and Public Transportation at 6th Annual NEREJ MSCC Summit







In mid-October, the Metro South Chamber of Commerce held its NEREJ Summit, "Tracks to Transformation: Integrating Real Estate and Public Transportation," at Showcase Cinema de Lux in Randolph. The event brought together developers, industry and municipal leaders, and real-estate professionals to explore how transit-oriented development can drive economic growth, equity, and community vibrancy in the Metro South region.

The morning featured a keynote by Ryan Coholan, COO of the MBTA, who shared insights on expanding public transit access and strengthening connections between housing and transit infrastructure. Attendees also heard from a panel of industry experts covering mixed-use development, public-private partnerships for affordable housing, and transit equity, followed by a presentation on Opportunity Zones by Russell Stein. Speakers included leaders from Brockton Area Transit (BAT) NorthMarq, Bridgewater State University, One Circle Co., and North Easton Savings Bank.

Guests leveraged the event as a networking forum—connecting over breakfast, discussing real estate opportunities, and building partnerships to advance transit-oriented housing across Metro South. Use Overlay District Zoning requirements, Hanson Station consists of two buildings with a total of 5 ground-level retail stores and 49 one- and two-bedroom apartments. The first

building, 999 Main Street, is 32,110 sq ft and fully occupied as of July 2024! Part two, 965 Main Street, is 36,000 sq ft, completed in the spring of 2025. With a total investment of \$12M, these two buildings combined bring 40-50 jobs to the site, 49 units of housing, 5 commercial spaces, and 100 construction jobs for the duration of the project. Egan Development and its founders have been developing "for sale and rental real estate" projects in the Metro South area for the last three decades. Father Bill's & MainSpring invested \$20 million to build a 31,500 sq. ft. multi-use campus on federal surplus land, the former U.S. Army Reserve Center adjacent to the Brockton VA Medical Center. The campus includes the 16,500 sq. ft. Smith Family Housing Resource Center (HRC), featuring a day center, health clinic, shelter, commercial kitchen and dining space, and access to showers, laundry, and technology, alongside Yawkey Hall, a 15,000 sq. ft. building

with 32 housing units. In May 2025, the organization relocated its Brockton shelter from 54 N. Main St. to this site, retaining 20 employees and creating 24 new jobs. 




